THE POWER OF CHOICE

In the library, we strive to let the kids have the power of choice. It can be frustrating when your child brings home a book that is too too easy or too difficult for them, but they are learning!

Here are some possible outcomes of students choosing their own books:

*The book might be too difficult for the child to read, but they love when you read it aloud to them

*They may learn to open the books and look at the text to decide if a book is a good fit for them

*When a book is chosen for it's pictures it reinforces the skill of pairing picture and text to absorb information, even if they cannot read the text

*They may learn that carrying around the largest, biggest book in the library isn't as fun as they thought it might be

*They may learn to stretch their imagination by making up their own stories based on what they see in the pictures

*They may try harder to read the difficult text because they have such an interest in the pictures, topic, or genre

If, after repeated tries, your child is still struggling with finding a good fit book, there are things we can do to help further guide them!

1. Non-fiction books that have a pink dot on them are geared for K-2 reading levels and books without a pink dot on them are geared for 3-5 reading levels

2. Chapter books with an early chapter book sticker on them are geared for reading levels K-2, while books without that sticker are geared for reading levels 3-5

3. Leveled readers all have a neon green sticker on them and are geared for beginning readers

4. Chapter books have a genre sticker on them, which can help the student pick out something they are more inclined to find interesting

5. If you consented to your child having library technology, they could check out the physical book and the audio book and read/listen at the same time

6. Reach out to your friendly librarian




BOOKS FOR CHRISTMAS

READ THE BOOK, WATCH A SHOW




SCHOOL FOR GOOD AND EVIL SERIES
